We will start working with our 9th and 10th preschools in 2023, have been able to provide book lending, parent training, and health and nutrition programs in all our schools and have officially begun construction on the Planting Seeds Community Center in Zones 3 and 7 of Guatemala City!

We will showcase the future Planting Seeds Community Center and have an interview with Academic Coordinator Martina Garcia to provide a more in depth perspective of Planting Seeds schools, transitioning back to in person learning and her growth as a leader. We will also review highlights from this year, preview what lies ahead, recognize the people who help make this work possible and share ways for you to get further involved in our work.

Construction is finally here!

On July 23rd, 2022, we began construction on the Planting Seeds Community Center! We expect to inaugurate the center between March and June of 2023. And now that inauguration is in the near future, we want to reflect upon and celebrate the work done by so many to make this dream a reality.

Why a Community Center?

We work with two preschools in zone 3 and 7 in Guatemala City, Esperanza Renovada and Initiative. Co-Executive Guatemala Youth Directors Shannon Moyle and Mac Philips have also worked in these communities since 2007 and 2010 respectively. With such strong relationships to the community, Shannon and Mac started to meet with community members with the idea of complementing our preschool work with family nurturing programming. Through community meetings and interviews, we learned that families need a space that is open after-hours and weekends, a space they can enter and leave at their choice, and a place that they can design and lead themselves.

In 2017, with the support of our Board of Directors, we launched a Capital Campaign to fund the Planting Seeds Community Center!



Then What Happened?

We continued our community based approach, forming a committee who helped find the land we purchased for the center. Saul Sanchez, a collaborative member and a father's nurturing participant, first found the land and negotiated the price with the owner. Saul and the collaborative have been vital to the success of this center and are thrilled to have such a large role in every step of the process.




We then hired an incredible architectural firm, Taller Acá, who conducted a community design process. They hosted 3 meetings with nearly 100 community members in each one. These meetings consisted of getting to know the community and their dreams for the center, codesigning the space, and validating the design. Our community collaborative had follow up meetings to provide insight and make decisions for the design.



What has construction been like?

We hired the construction firm CPM. They first cleared and leveled the land. They then drilled twenty-two 7.5 meter holes into the ground and filled them with "Pilotes", which are metal spiral structures, put in places to support the foundation of the center. After cementing in these pilotes, we were able to start building the first and second floors of the building! Some community members have been hired by the construction company, as contruction workers and carpenters. By doing this, we have been able to provide necessary employment for many extremely talented community members.



Why did it take so long and when will it be ready?

It took us a 4-5 years to fundraise for the center and 2 years to receive construction permits from the Municipality. We expect to inaugurate the center in the summer of 2023! During this time, we have launched community programs and have worked to train members of the community to lead them. We have also helped strengthen the Network of Organizations in Zones 3 and 7.

Our team is now better equipped to lead this center and we have many collaborations in place to help strengthen our work in the community.



How is this funded?

One of the most special parts of this project has been the involvement of so many people from so many different places in the world. Our Capital Campaign Committee helped initiate our fundraising plan for the center. We have gone to Ottawa, Pembroke, and Hamilton, Ontario; Portland, Maine; Chicago and Northbrook, Illinois; Traverse City, Michigan; Durham, North Carolina; Bethesda, Maryland; Guatemala City, and Philadelphia, to meet with people and raise money for the center. Our supporters have hosted events, sponsored bricks and rooms for the center to make this a reality. We have also gained incredible support from the Guatemalan UWARA Rotary Club, and many Rotary Clubs throughout the US in Wisconsin, South Carolina, Ohio, Maryland and California. Collectively, through amazing leadership, they were able to fund the entire interior for the Community Center!

Meet Martina García

Martina García has been working with the Planting Seeds Methodology since 2007. She is our Academic Coordinator and brings a lot of experience and knowledge to our preschool programs. At Planting Seeds, we know that Martina is reliable, organized, and caring and that her enthusiasm for our mission shows in the love she puts into her everyday work. Martina supervises our preschool programs, trains teachers, gives feedback, plans the academic schedule and participates on our leadership team. Through this interview with Martina, we hope to provide an inside look at our education programs this year and our plans for growth. We also hope to showcase our investment in the development of our team to lead change throughout Guatemala.

Martina, How was your journey to becoming the Academic Coordinator at Planting Seeds?

I'm originally from Tecpan, a town located in Chimaltenango, and it was there where I had my first experience as a teacher. First working with teenagers, and later on, working in early childhood stimulation with children under 2. In 2004, I moved to Guatemala City and began working with a partner NGO that used the Planting Seeds Methodology in their classrooms.

I worked with 2-3 year old children, and later on as a teacher in 1st grade of elementary school. Through these experiences, I developed my passion for education, and particularly my love for the Planting Seeds methodology as a way of teaching through play. In 2014, I was invited by Planting Seeds to work as a teacher, coordinator and facilitator.

What is unique about the Planting Seeds Methodology to you?

I love that it's not a traditional school system where children sit in front of a desk to listen to the teacher. The Planting Seeds Methodology is centered on developing the child holistically and it's based on play. Children move from one learning center to another while playing and having fun. I also like that the methodology keeps adapting, and we always look for new strategies and techniques to improve our work.



Tell me about a Planting Seeds student that has inspired you!

This year Juana Raquel graduated from our preschool program! She joined Planting Seeds two years ago, when she was five years old. The first year of school was challenging for her. She struggled a lot to develop the skills expected at her age. At the end of last year, we realized that she wasn't ready to go to 1st grade. We talked to her parents and suggested that Juana stay another year with us to get her to a good level, which would set her up for success in primary school. Her parents accepted and tried to be more present and support her at home.

We knew she struggled in a lot of areas. She needed to develop her fine motor skills, learn to identify letters, and develop her confidence. We worked a lot with her and her parents this year. We saw a shift in her mother. She learned stimulate her more at home, and continually asked for advice from the teachers, which helped Juana a lot. At the end of this year, Juana achieved so much! She could write her own name, read simple sentences, and improved her writing skills. It was inspiring to see her improving, and we all felt proud and happy with her progress. The mother developed a closer relationship with the teachers, and they shared a lot of strategies with her to help Juana. At the end of the year, Juana seemed more confident and happier and trusted her abilities. That extra year at our preschool really helped. Next year, she will have more chances to succeed in school,

which makes a huge difference!

These are the kind of stories that inspire me and give meaning to what we do.

These stories make me want to continue giving my best to ensure our students get high-quality holistic education, because all we do is for them.

How have you grown as a leader this year?

I did a Restorative Leadership training with a partner organization called Circula. It helped me develop confidence as a leader. Something that I remember from the course is the phrase, "We are in this together". It helps me remind myself that I'm not alone, and that the work we do as a team is important and that we are all responsible for both our achievements and failures. I've tried to remember this in my work as a leader.

This year, we also had a staff retreat with Alba Nueva, and we learned the importance of using our voices. I sometimes struggle with this, but the retreat helped me reflect on the importance of using my voice, and now I always remember that I have to do it!

All these years working at Planting Seeds I've learned a lot. Even though the methodology and place of work are the same, I learn something new every year. I also feel that I have contributed ideas to the organization, and I'm excited to see how some of those ideas benefit our students.



We want our students to have access to books beyond their time in our preschool. For this reason, we look to convert our preschools into community libraries in the next few years.




